


auction with various donated items. All proceeds from the auctions went to the Alumni Association.



# Note from Andy Clark

One score and 5 years ago, a small group of friends did their level best to get something they believed in off the ground. Even after attending the formal and having a few days to process the idea, I am still amazed that there was a 25th anniversary celebration commemorating the event. How I wish that for just a little while I could take everyone back in time to see first-hand how it happened (additionally, it would confirm that we all were thinner, better looking and had hair that wasn't gray...a bonus).

If I could take you back, the first thing that would become painfully obvious is that we quite literally had no idea what we were doing; we faked it - a lot. Think of it this way, everything that was a "run of the mill standard practice" to other organizations was brand new to us. Several times we took hour long turns on the phone to copy down an entire manual the Purdue guys had to read to us because we had no idea we needed it for something or other the next day. Keep in mind that today's ubiquitous email addresses weren't readily available yet. Because we often did the "listen and copy routine", we always had one copy of whatever the document was to share, a tradition that apparently continues to this day judging from this years' alumni meeting...

You would be able to see the process that we had to go through to successfully charter with Sigma Tau Gamma within our allotted timeframe. You could see the countless all-nighters we spent writing or typing out the paperwork under seemingly impossible deadlines while trying to keep up on grades and classes. The mea culpa calls to Bill Bernier and requests for him to bail us out when we'd made a mistake in the paperwork somewhere along the way. Without that man, we wouldn't be here.

Another man crucial to our effort was Stan "The Man" Nnochirionye, our first advisor and the person who coined the phrase "back inna Buffalo" where he was an undergrad brother of Sig Tau. He believed in us, kept us out of trouble for the most part and pointed us in the right direction when we were lost.

He always told us that someday we would be able to say "back inna Terre Haute", well I said that Saturday just for you Stan, much love brother.

After we chartered, you could have watched us listen politely to the University / The Interfraternity Council and various other groups of people on campus tell us "no", and then watch us do it anyway - repeatedly. "You can't come to the IFC meetings", ok that's fine...We sent Lenell and Pete to the first ones (the loudest human being I know and a future prominent lawyer respectively) which is why we owned the IFC in a matter of months after that. "We're not sure if you can enter homecoming events" hmmm, good to know. We paired ourselves up for homecoming and competed anyway. "Well, you absolutely cannot have a floor in Sandison hall"...We'll take that under advisement and we all put our housing on the line when we signed up for Sandison Hall 5th floor the next semester, essentially daring the university to do something to us. We moved in EARLY on day 1 and took the position that possession was 9/10th of the law and we never looked back. We intentionally put the university in an awkward position, knowing full well there was no real recourse for them that wouldn't risk being a PR issue. Building on that success we demanded that our letters be placed on the front of the dorm just like every other fraternity - there was no argument as it was done relatively quickly. That's when we knew we had made it...we were a real fraternity.

As we travel back to the present day, you'd see that a couple of things have remained constant over the years. We have always been friends first and a fraternity second. That was the way we always thought it should be, regardless of what anyone else thought. Secondly, the small group of us that started STG did so for a lot of good reasons most of which were groundbreaking at the time. Regardless of who you were, where you were from or the color of your skin we were all friends and Sig Tau brothers, that is something I am still proud of to this day and that is what sets us apart from what fraternities usually are — it's what makes us different.

Thank you all for your hard work making the 25th anniversary celebration a success, it was truly a great time and I look forward to many more years.
