Active Chapter Update

For those of you who are confused about the status of the active chapter and you missed the details at the annual meeting, the active chapter STILL EXISTS. It is undergoing a restructuring process with the Phired Up recruitment company.

Last fall, Headquarters met with the active chapter and interviewed every active brother to determine if they met the "Sig Tau" standards. After these interviews, the active chapter was left with 9 brothers. These guys started this semester off with Josh Orendi of Phired Up and they underwent a serious effort of rebuilding the Delta Tau chapter with quality brothers. This current group of 9 brothers is a very strong and committed to Sig Tau.

Starting the semester off, they had 85 potential prospects for recruitment. Of those 85, there were 34 guys they were actively recruiting/pursuing. After Initiation on April 29th, they ended up adding 3 guys to the chapter. This is a pretty decent effort considering our history of spring recruitment.

They did not just pursue anyone. They actually had standards for requirements to become a brother. These standards were discussed and agreed upon by Jordan, Braydon, Mike Van Camp, Zac Garner, Ben Miller, Chad Smith and Curt Binder. Here are the standards:

- 1. GPA minimum of 2.80 (which is the IFC average at ISU) High school or last semester of college.
- 2. Association fee due upon acceptance of Bid. (\$50) to be paid to OmegaFi directly.
- 3. Signed agreement that initiation fee (\$235 needs to be confirmed) is due by the end of the semester. Members with outstanding initiation fees will not be able to be an active part of the chapter till fee is paid. Agreement should also list what the expected dues per semester are. This should also include national fees and charges.
- 4. Omega account set up with social security number signed contracts, correct billing info.
- 5. Demonstrates an interest in serving on executive fraternity leadership boards. (E-board / J-Board / IFC board / Student Gov. ect.)
- 6. Involved within at least one other organization on or off-campus (I.E. Student Gov., sports / athletics, Radio station, Junior Computer Genius, PHI Mu Alpha, JROTC, American Legion, 4-H, Jaycee's ect.)

The actives are off to a great start. Let them know it. Let's continue to show them that the alumni are behind them and supporting them in their efforts to keep Sigma Tau Gamma alive at Indiana State University.

Chapter Recruitment

We, the Association Board, feel that communication is important with the alumni. For those who did not make it to the annual meeting, this is the recruitment proposal that was presented by Zac Garner. It was voted on and passed by the Association.

Investment in recruitment for the future of the Delta Tau Chapter by Zac Garner

I am proposing that we allocate \$10,000 to a long term plan for recruitment, training, growth and development for the Delta Tau chapter at Indiana State University.

My vision/plan extends for 3 years. We are currently 4 months into the first year. It works alongside the HQ to build a chapter at Indiana State University that will have the correct foundation to last another 26. We will have benchmarks for achievement and guidance on if the plan is working. At the time a benchmark is not achieved it will be up to the current board of directors to make the call if we proceed with the plan.

Year one (2016): "The Draft!!"

Started the restructuring at 9 active members. A partnership with Phired Up Inc. is contracted by the HQ. Cost \$10,900 plus recruitment membership fees of \$150. We have been asked to cover \$2500 of that fee. The alumni are also expected to be involved and offer motivation and support at events and calls with the chapter. Communication will be key during this rebuilding. The HQ and Alumni Association will be responsible for training and developing a chapter that understands the basic skills of running a chapter, setting up budgets, planning events, looking to the future and respecting the campus and community.

Benchmark for 2016: Double the chapter size. This means in December 2016 we have a chapter size of 18 men who are upholding the principles and following New Member expectations listed below. Also 75% current payments and 100% current association and initiation fees paid.

Year 2 (2017): "A Road to the Playoff's"

Year two of a partnership with Phired Up Inc. Cost \$10,900. They will be responsible for chapter recruitment training and growth. They will also perform the on campus training as they did in 2016. The HQ and Alumni Association will continue the growth and training of chapter members on running a successful chapter. It would also be a goal to involve other successful chapters in the area to do joint retreats with. The HQ has committed to supporting this year of training, as long as the Alumni Association and members are committed to the chapter as well. They will ask for the same split as 2016 (\$2,500) but have also requested that the Alumni Association plan and support a joint, day retreat with the chapter on a team building course. I.E. Ropes course, problem solving camp ect.

Benchmark for 2017: A 40 man chapter that is living the principles of our fraternity. Involved in campus events and supporting the community. 75% of membership payments are to be current to OmegaFi and no active with a net 90 or longer AR statement. This is important because at 40 members, the new Sigma Tau Gamma Housing Company will support the idea of obtaining chapter housing. The chapter will need to prove the ability to stay current with standards, dues, insurance, and fees to be considered.

Year 3 (2018): "The Championship Team"

This year we will contract Phired up for onsite training for the Fall semester, (\$2,000). This will be a refresher for the chapter on the skills that have been shown over the last 2 years. Spring semester in 2018 will be done without the guidance of Phired Up and will be a good indicator for that new board on if more than one session is needed in the Fall. The benchmark for the end of 2018: Chapter size of 50+ members. New chapter housing. The foundation of a chapter that can support itself and be a value to the Sigma Tau Gamma origination, a value to the campus and the community of Indiana State University.

My personal goal, to be able to come down to Homecoming (yes I will miss a Notre Dame Game if needed) and not have to handle anything but having a good time. It is possible we just all have to fight for it.
