Presidential Update

It has been a busy start for this term! I can't believe we are only 4 months into it. I want to start off by thanking my fellow board members for working so hard. They are working hard to make sure we are growing our membership and providing events that all brothers and families will enjoy. We have more on the horizon so don't book up your fall without checking the website or social media to see what events we have coming up. It has seemed like we have had events just about every other week, whether they were an official alumni event, wedding, race or party. It has been a great start. This past month it was my great honor to be able to represent our association at the Sig Tau National meeting in Minneapolis, Minnesota. This was an off election year meeting, so no changes in the board or laws, but there was huge news released.

The national head quarters will be moving from our founding site in Warrensburg, MO to Indianapolis, IN. The new HQ will be located on the north side of town in what is described as fraternity row. Many are unaware that over 50 fraternal organizations call Indianapolis home. It is considered the epicenter for Greek life. This will help the origination retain better staff, have resources specific to fraternity life, and give us a more central location for all our current chapters.

For the Delta Tau chapter this should be a huge resource. With the base of operations being only 1 hour from Indiana State we should be able to tap the resources of the HQ in a more consistent way. It will also make travel for meeting like the presidents' academy and regional meetings closer and easier to attend for our chapter members. It will also give us the opportunity to hold meeting and events at the new location.

The final location is still not being released. It has been purchased and renovations will start soon.

The plan is to have the office officially moved and doing business by the 1st of the year in Indianapolis. Be looking out for an event welcoming the new staff to the areas.

I was also able to meet with many alumni and the new WPN house company director. Here is a posting from their website: "Established in 2014, the WPN National Housing Company is its own distinct legal entity, considered an LLC by the federal government and is separate from the Sigma Tau Gamma Fraternity. The WPN Housing Company exists to enhance the undergraduate fraternity experience by providing assistance, support, and property management for undergraduate members of Sigma Tau Gamma." Currently they are managing 3 properties and have 6 building projects in the works. The way housing will now work is that all housing (rented or owned) will go through the WPN. This will eliminate the alumni from having to manage or be the landlord for the chapter. As someone who has been in that spot I can say I think this will be a huge benefit. We discussed different investment opportunities and the guidelines for which the WPN has set for a chapter to obtain housing. It is our hope with the Chapters continued growth and improvement that we will be working with the WPN in the future to obtain housing once again for the chapter. Chapter Status

The brothers of Sigma Tau Gamma Fraternity are ready to take on another school year at Indiana State University. We are excited to see what the 2017-18 school year will have in store for our chapter. Our expectations for the year are higher than ever before. As a chapter we know this year is our make it or break it year. We cannot afford to make any more mistakes as we all know our punishments will be a removal from campus as a fraternity. Therefore, all of our brothers are dedicated, motivated, hungry, and in desperate need of a successful school year as we will make this year our best yet!

While preparing for recruitment this fall, we came up with a plan to have events that will set our members up for easy conversations to get to know each other on a personal level. Our goal was to have events to where people will be more active as listeners and speakers. One of our rush events that supports this claim was our Meet the Brothers rush event. This was a successful way for potential pledges to get to know us on a personal level as we got to know more about them as well. Everyone had a chance to speak as we all went around the room and shared some information about ourselves regarding to our goals, families, life lessons, and obstacles we faced in our lives. It was a special moment because everyone learned something new about each brother and potential pledges which is what a brotherhood is all about.

Homecoming: Homecoming this year will be on October 21, 2017. Last year we had an okay turn out, but this year we plan on doing it big. We still plan on grilling during the tent city, having some sort of game going on with music and everyone having a good time and enjoying each other's company. In conclusion, we're happy and excited about the direction that our chapter is heading. This year will be the year that Sigma Tau Gamma will no longer be taken as a joke, as we will handle our business inside and outside of the classroom.
